TIHU COLLEGE GREEN AUDIT REPORT 2021-2022



ABOUT TIHU COLLEGE

Tihu College is one of the premiere academic institutions of higher education affiliated to Gauhati University located at the heart of the Tihu town of Nalbari District, Assam. The college was established on 4th July, 1963 and started functioning from the Tihu Gandhi Bhawan. Later, the college was shifted to the present site ($26^{\circ}28'40''$ N to $26^{\circ}28'45''$ N and $91^{\circ}16'00''$ E to $91^{\circ}16'05''$ E) on 15th of August, 1966.

After coming under the fold of Deficit Grants-in-Aid system of Govt. of Assam in 1969, the College has been showing the marks of progress in all respects to the satisfaction of the students and guardians along with the elite education-enthusiasts of greater Tihu, Namati, Baksa, Khetri and Dharmapur areas of Nalbari, Baksa and Barpeta districts of Assam in last five decades. The serene beauty and eco-friendly campus of the College with calm green surroundings is conducive to the pursuit of academic activities.

With the full-fledged streams of Arts and Science and Major course in all the teaching departments, Tihu College continues to add new feathers in its cap so far as its academic excellence is concerned. The College was therefore accredited for the second time with B+ Grade by the NAAC during the academic session 2016-17.

A total of 2526 students enrolled in the UG courses (including HS programme) at Tihu College in the session 2020-2021 against the 48 faculty members including one librarian. There are 21 supporting staffs at present in the college. The Principal is the chief executive of the College and the Vice Principal who has been nominated from the teachers is assisting him in academic activities.

GREEN AUDIT AT TIHU COLLEGE

Participating in the “Green Campus, Clean Campus” mission launched by the University Grants Commission for all higher educational institution of India and in compliance with the . ‘Environmental Consciousness’ a mandatory criterion (Criterion VII) of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), the sustainability and sustainable development policies are kept on the agenda of Tihu College. Green Audit is one of the step which has therefore been taken up by the College in order to record, document, analyse and report of the environmental constituents of the college through an impartial and inclusive method. It is anticipated that Green Auditing has helped the institute in preserving the rich floral and faunal diversity in and around the campus; garnering interest and creating awareness among the stakeholders.

Tihu College is committed to responsible stewardship of resources and to demonstrate leadership in sustainable academic practices for a better tomorrow with the policy goals of Green audit as follows .

- Identification and documentation of the ecofriendly practices for a sustainable college campus
- Increasing awareness amongs the all stakeholders for sustainable use of available resources.
- Collection of baseline data on different components of environment before pose threat to the college and the society.

To achieve the aforementioned goals, the present audit endeavours towards the following objectives:

- ❖ To identify current and emerging environmental issues.
- ❖ To monitor environmental management practices.
- ❖ To create awareness among the various stakeholders of the College.
- ❖ To prepare a status report on environmental compliances

AUDIT STAGE

Green auditing is the process of identifying and determining whether the College maintains eco-friendly and sustainable practices. As an effective ecological tool, it helps to create a culture of sustainability as an administrative policy throughout an organization and it needs to be implemented through regular identification, quantification, documenting, reporting and monitoring of environmentally important components.

Green auditing in Tihu College began with the formation of the Green Audit team incorporating faculty members and researcher of Gauhati University and Tihu College. The audit team visited the campus on regular basis and monitored different facilities from the audit perspectives and, simultaneously made the assessment of the status of the green cover of the Institution followed by waste management practices and energy conservation strategies, etc. Data collection was done by onsite visit through structured questionnaires in different sectors such as water, energy, waste, biodiversity status. The data were collated accordingly and analyzed to prepare this Green Audit report of Tihu College. The Audit team was led by Prof. Partha Pratim Baruah, Department of Botany, Gauhati University and Chairperson, Gauhati University Green Audit Committee (2019-2022).

METHODOLOGY ADOPTED

The methodology adopted to conduct the Green Audit of Tihu College had the following components

- On site field visits by the Green Audit Team at and when necessary.
- Data collection were done through distribution of structured questionnaires amongst different stakeholders and interviews with the executives, official staffs and general students.
- The water quality analysis was done at the Plant Ecology Laboratory of Gauhati University.
- GIS tools were used to prepare the map of the campus for LULC survey
- Different standard taxonomic and ecological protocols were followed to document and estimate the floral and faunal account for biodiversity audit.

**ACADEMIC AUDIT OF TIHU COLLEGE

Overall observations and Recommendations

During the visit of the Academic Team, the Principal, Vice Principal and the Coordinator of IQAC apprised the team on various academic aspects of the College and facilitate the team to visit all departments, centres and facilities. The members had department wise detailed interactions on points necessary for a healthy teaching-learning environment. The Committee's focal points for these interactions were guided by the matrices that will be assessed by NAAC, which the College authority is contemplating to invite shortly. Overall, the Committee is happy to see the positive developments in the College even in the pandemic situation and consequent countrywide lockdown.

Though the science stream was recent in the college, organisational set up in each Department along with the laboratories are good. All Departments under the Arts faculty were also nicely organized and functional. Out of a total of 42 faculty members, 19 are with Ph. D. degree, and this is about 45.24% out of the permanent faculties.

It is noted with concern that a few Departments are running with very limited faculty members against the sanctioned post which need to be strengthened considering the students' enrolment in recent years. Chemistry, Political Science and Sanskrit, though are important subjects, have been suffering for lesser number of teachers. It is hoped that the appointments in these Departments shall be made as soon as possible.

The College has the provision of recording data on the Class register, student's progression and alumni in each department which the committee feels a good academic practice. The Records submitted by almost all the departments for the verification of the Committee and the same are duly

noted. The record-keeping in the departments are seen to be systematic.

The Committee has noticed that a few faculty members have publications in high impact factor journals and UGC CARE listed journals, which is a good sign. However, the majority of the members' publications are not in high-quality journals or books. The committee advises not to waste time and energy for the sake of numbers of publication, instead the faculty members should try for better publication in standard journals. Though potentiality exists, research enthusiasm seems to be missing; hence, the Committee recommends submitting research proposals by the faculty members to various funding institutions.

The College conducted a good number of initiatives on faculty development in teaching-learning in the last few years and the teachers are benefited by taking part in such programmes.

The Committee is happy to note that in some departments the pass percentage is more than 80% in major subjects. A good number of students could secure first class in University examinations from the college, which is laudable. The committee is worried about the fact that the overall pass percentage in general courses is not satisfactory.

It is very satisfying to notice that almost 70 percentage of the faculty members are trained with application of ICT tools, specifically in the use of the internet in teaching-learning. A few faculty members are actively engaged in the preparation of e-contents. These contents are disseminated among the students, which are very helpful for the students. The Committee wishes to upgrade those teaching materials regularly and put in use for the benefit of learners. The college authority may take initiatives to institute a biennial teacher award to encourage the teachers.

The College campus is having sound internet connectivity with a dedicated leased line which helps the students and teachers interacting and collating study materials. It is a worthy step taken by the College authority. The college has three well-equipped Computer labs with dedicated browsing centres for teachers and students. The college is trying to generate some resources by offering a few self-financing courses. The B Voc. section is helping in generating much-needed skills in the areas of Computer Application and Food Sciences.

The College Library has been provided with all modern settings. There are 41167 books, 37 periodicals and a remote access facility. The library is yet to be fully automated; the committee therefore suggests expediting the process on priority basis. The students-support and counseling for "how to use the college library" is a regular practice that is assumed to be a good student-friendly practice of the College.

The faculty with active encouragement from the IQAC prepared the Lesson Plans for each of the courses. The committee has appreciated the coordination that exists between administration and the faculty members.

The College with the initiatives of the different Departments and IQAC Cell organized several programmes in last couple of years, which is commendable. The College Canteen is good. From the students' welfare side, the College has a stadium, well-laid sports facilities, girls' and boys' common rooms, hostels etc. The committee is pleased to see the Day Care Centre for the wards of the faculty members along with the activities of NSS and NCC cadets. These can be treated as one of the best practices of the college for the welfare of students and staff members.

The team prefers to appreciate the Department of Education for the community services and well documentation of the records and the Department of Mathematics, Philosophy, Zoology for their academic initiatives.


Specific Suggestions:


The committee feels it as a duty to offer certain suggestions for the improvement of the academic atmosphere of the college. However, these are not stand-alone activities; rather they would be a part of continuous efforts of the faculty members and administration of the college in their relentless pursuit towards achieving the highest academic standard.


- Lesson plans may be prepared based on the PO-CO matrix for all programmes.
- More Student-friendly wellness programmes incorporating Yoga etc. along with regular courses may be started.
- It is suggested to maintain students' progression records along with their performances which could be displayed in each Department to encourage the budding students stepping into the college.
- Efforts may be initiated on an urgent basis for improvement of the pass percentage in general courses (and in some of the major subjects).
- A database on slow learners may be kept ready so that more and more remedial classes/doubt clearing sessions/one-to-one contact counseling may be arranged at a time mutually convenient for faculty and such struggling students with the initiative of administration.
- Departments may be awarded based on performances. A teacher award may also be instituted.

- Research works should be promoted among the faculty and they may be encouraged to publish in reputed Journals only. To create a more conducive publication atmosphere in the college, best researcher award may be instituted for the faculty members.
- Faculty members may be encouraged to publish more text and reference books through peer review mechanism.
- Subjects like, Sanskrit and Chemistry should be more effective and vibrant.
- Steps should be taken in augmenting the 'Department of Food Science'.
- If budget permits every faculty should be allotted a PC with a dedicated LAN connection.
- Teachers may still be encouraged to take part in more quality improvement programmes offered by reputed institutions even in offline mode without disrupting the regular academic activities.
- Students' Satisfaction Survey should be conducted regularly preferably after completion of each Semester so that the issues if any of the previous Semesters could be traced and resolved.
- Though the College has tremendous potential as a whole, full dedication is expected from each and every faculty member to bring laurel to the College.
