## TIHU COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

Tihu College, Tihu is a premier institution of higher education in Assam, India. Accredited with a 'B' Grade (3<sup>rd</sup> Cycle) by the NAAC, Bangalore, the College has the distinction of being a three stream college with Arts, Commerce and Science. The college offers Undergraduate Courses in altogether 16 departments, besides offering Post-Graduate Courses in 2 departments at present. Established on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 1963, the College was affiliated to Gauhati University, Guwahati in 1969 and was brought under Deficit Grants-in-Aid system of the Govt. of Assam the same year. The College was provincialized by the Govt. of Assam in 2005. The long and eventful history of this glorious institution for more than last six decades is studded with brilliant records of academic as well as extra-curricular achievements. With an aim to imbibe the spirit of holistic education, the College has been striving hard to provide vistas to the students to uplift the standard of their life. The College has remarkably developed its infrastructure at par with the requirements of changing needs of time. It's natural, in such a backdrop, that students of the college have shown their exuberance and potential in the state and the national level too. Tihu College has the glorious history of organizing Gauhati University Inter-College Football Tournament in 1987 and the G.U Inter-College Zonal Youth Festival in October, 2017, and a state level prizemoney arm wrestling championship this year. Ever since its inception, Tihu College has been an epitome of educational achievement and human resource development. Being a sexagenary institution, the college has brilliant records of excellence in academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular arenas. We pledge to give our best to our students, to make them better citizens, to help them live better in a challenging world. We see to it that the knowledge our students garner here paves way to their destination. A new and modern Conference Room with 80 seat capacity has been active to facilitate departmental seminars/ workshops. Moreover, quality training sessions and career counseling for those opting for competitive examination en route to services are also equally entertained.

You will be happy to know that there have been constant efforts to develop infrastructure to provide best facilities to our students. These efforts have finally been materialized into reality with General Development Assistance of Rs. 1 crore from the Govt. of Assam and our Hon'ble Rajya Sabha MP and former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh's grant of Rs. 40 lakh from MP LAD. It is to be mentioned here that the Administrative Building and the Central Library have already been operative and the ground floor of the project was completed in 2021. New classrooms and an IT Lab have already been constructed with the assistance of RUSA grants. A new RCC Boys' Hostel is under construction with infrastructure development grants from the DHE, Govt. of Assam.

I am happy to inform you that the Star College Scheme under the DBT, Govt of India for vertical upliftment of the college was granted to three science departments- Botany, Physics and Chemistry- for three years. # TIHU COLLEGE - A PROFILE

Tihu College has been one of the premier institutions of higher education in Assam. Having trodden 61 odd years of spreading illumination in society, the college has celebrated its Golden Jubilee in March, 2013, and Diamond Jubilee in February, 2024 last. Tihu College was established on a very auspicious day, July 04, 1963, fulfilling the dream of acquiring quality higher education for the people, inculcated by a group of illustrious personalities with support from the rural masses of greater Tihu area. Under the dynamic leadership with relentless and untiring efforts, of Late Sailendra Prasad Medhi, the founder Principal of the College, it grew into one of the premier rural institutions imparting education right from H.S. to Undergraduate and Post-Graduate levels. The College has come across a long way with more than six decades of eventful history behind it catering to the needs of the students opting for higher education in the greater Tihu, Namati, Barama, Mushalpur, Doomni, Khetri and Dharmapur areas of Nalbari, Baksa, Bajali, and Barpeta districts of Assam. Even after emergence of almost a dozen colleges in the same hinterland, Tihu College still continues its rich intellectual heritage and academic ethos.

Beginning with the Arts Stream (in night shift) in the year of its inception, the College was first housed in the Tihu Gandhi Bhawan. It was affiliated to Gauhati University in 1969 itself. The College was shifted to the present site on 15th of August, 1966. It was brought under the Deficit Grants-in-Aid system by the Govt. of Assam in 1969. Since then the College has been showing the marks of progress in all respects to the satisfaction of the students and guardians alike, along with the elite education-enthusiasts of this vast area. The serene beauty and eco-friendly campus of the College with calm green surroundings is conducive to the pursuit of academic activities.

Over the years, Tihu College has burgeoned, from its nascent stage, to a centre of quality education, nurturing simultaneously both scholastic and non-scholastic curricular endeavours. The long sixty-two years of this glorious institution's march have been filled with a brilliant train of academic performance in the examinations conducted by the G.U. & AHSEC, accompanied by numerous extra-curricular achievements and accolades every year.

With the full-fledged streams of Arts and Science and Major course in almost all the teaching departments, Tihu College continues to add new feathers in its cap so far as its academic excellence is concerned. Besides, the College has also introduced the Commerce Stream in the undergraduate levels from the academic session 2015-16, with provision of Major Courses in Accountancy and Management. As such, the College has emerged as a full-fledged three stream academic institution. In view of the current demand and changing scenario, the College has introduced such professional and career-oriented courses like Three Year BCA and One Year PGDCA courses. Since 2011-12, Tihu College has been successfully implementing the semester system in undergraduate levels introduced by Gauhati University. From the academic session 2019-20, the College implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and FYUGP from 2023-24 in the Undergraduate levels. Moreover, regular Post-Graduate courses under Gauhati University, in Education and History, with an intake capacity of 22 students each at present, have been introduced from the academic session, 2017-18. The current session will be marked by a few well equipped Digital Classrooms, two multi-media rooms with necessary audio-visual

amenities, and an IT Lab. to ensure fruitful teaching -learning activities.

The aim of all educational programmes at Tihu College is to foster a spirit of academic excellence, to encourage critical thinking, create innovative ways to broaden horizons and discover the liberating power of new ideas and insights. It is, however, a delight to declare that apart from the academic progress the college is moving ahead with the objectives of the fullest exploration of inherent talents of the students in extra curricular arena. The College has a glorious history of organizing the G.U. Inter-College Football Tournament in 1987. In October 2017 last, the College successfully organized the G.U. Inter-College Zonal Youth Festival. Tihu College welcomes and entertains the blooming talents with due weightage in admission process and strives to provide all possible infrastructural facilities. There are well qualified, dedicated teachers in each department. It is noteworthy to mention that the College is the first to get assessed within the Nalbari district by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore in 2004 and was accredited 'B+' grade. The College was accredited for the second time with B+ Grade by the NAAC in the academic session 2016-17, and with a B grade for its 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle in 2023-24. It vows to attain substantial progress and run ahead in the days to come with the tireless efforts and zeal of the teachers, the students, the guardians, the alumni, the society and all related stakeholders at large.

In the new academic session 2025-26, Tihu College extends its warm welcome to the fresh scholars and bonafide students and hopes that its peaceful academic environment with good teaching-learning process would positively help them to reach their goals in life.



# MISSION AND VISION

## THE CAMPUS

Tihu College has the following two campuses with two blocks adjacent to each other in the Eastern Campus.

### A. EASTERN CAMPUS

#### 1. The South Block or Administrative Block

It comprises of one academic block, the Principal's Chamber, the Principal's Office, the Vice-Principal's Office, and the Office of the Examination Branch, a newly built Conference Hall with all modern amenities, besides a few classrooms. Moreover, at present there are ten departments-

Construction of a new multi-storied Post-Graduate Block funded by the College has already been completed. Besides, construction works on another multi-storied building to house science laboratories with grants from the Govt. of Assam have been nearing completion. Moreover, construction of a new three storey Administrative Building cum Digital Library Block (Ground Floor) has already been operative with aid from MPLAD fund. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor of this building has been developed from the Reserve Fund. Works on another Academic Block have been nearing completion with grants from RUSA.

## 2. The North Block

It comprises a Conference Hall cum Teachers' Common Room, the Central Library, Library Reading Room, Bio-Tech Hub, Day Care Centre, a newly constructed and well equipped Gymnasium Hall, Classrooms, Laboratories, and a well-furnished Canteen. Besides, the Office of the Community College lies in this block, which has presently been running the classes of the Diploma in Food Processing. In this block there are also six departments -

- (i) Assamese      (ii) English      (iii) Mathematics
- (iv) Geography      (v) Computer Science

## B. WESTERN CAMPUS

This campus is located on the east bank of the river Tihu. It comprises a spacious playground with 4 acres of land. The southern part of this campus is the site that houses the Boys' Hostel of the College. A new RCC Boys' Hostel with 66 seat capacity has been under construction with 1 crore infrastructure development grant from the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam and is likely to be operative from the next academic session.

# INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

## Central Library

The Central Library of the college has a collection of nearly 42,000 *books* besides as many as 43 *journals, magazines and periodicals*. The Library also maintains Book Bank provision consisting of around 5,000 *essential books* for financially disadvantaged students.

## Departmental Library and Teachers' Common Room

Each Department has a separate departmental common room for teachers along with a Departmental Library, which is enriched with textbooks, reference books and journals of the concerned Department.

### Laboratory

All Science Departments along with Department of Geography, Department of Education and Department of Computer Science have well equipped Laboratory facilities. A new laboratory for Physics Department has been constructed with the aid of the UGC. Special power supply facility has been provided to all these laboratories for smooth conduct of practical classes. Besides, construction works on another multi-storied building to house especially the science laboratories with grants from the Govt. of Assam have already been nearing completion and installation works are also swiftly progressing. The College authority is earnestly working to this end so that the new laboratory with all modern amenities will be fully operative from the current academic session itself.

### Hostel

A well furnished two-storey RCC Women's Hostel with full facilities for accommodation of girl students from far flung areas is operative at present. The Women's Hostel funded by the UGC has 68 seat capacity. All boarders here can have access to modern amenities for their academic and recreational needs. One two storey RCC Boys' Hostel to be built with a one crore assistance has been sanctioned by the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam during this session.

### Auditorium

Tihu College possesses a large and attractive auditorium named "K.C. Deka Memorial Auditorium". The state of the art auditorium has been renovated during the academic session 2017-18 with all modern amenities. It is acoustic and has modern sound and lighting systems. With comfortable sitting for guests and a seat capacity of 450 persons, it is a readily accessible place to organize all Academic and Cultural programmes, Symposiums, Seminars, Workshops, Training programmes etc.

### Canteen

A well equipped and hygienic canteen has been serving the college family since 2003. Built with financial assistance from the Tihu College Teachers' Unit (TCTU), the canteen is run by a local party on lease. Students as well as teachers too get due facilities here for refreshment during the college hours.

### Chilled Pure Drinking Water

Water is the elixir of life. Pure drinking water is a must for a healthy life. The students can avail chilled and pure UV-treated drinking water within the college campus, in both North and South Blocks, thus ensuring their own health and well-being.

### Playground

The College playground, situated on the east bank of the river Tihu in a sylvan setting, provides facilities for Athletics, Football, Cricket and other Outdoor Games. A beautiful and comfortable pavilion with facilities of dressing room has been constructed for sports persons and guest spectators as well.

Volleyball, Badminton and Kabaddi courts are available within the main campus of the College, in the North Block. Besides, a scientifically framed out Basketball Court has already been constructed in the same block in 2015 and it has been available for the students' use.

### Gymnasium

A well-equipped and modern Gymnasium Hall with full facilities is operative from the last academic session. It is constructed with funds spared from the Golden Jubilee Celebration of the College. Tihu College possesses so many modern equipments of Gymnasium which have already been installed in the Gymnasium Hall. Students and local enthusiasts have easy access to these modern equipments.

### Day Care Centre

A Day Care Centre has been built with the aid of the UGC funds within the College Campus **for supporting the nutritional needs of the little sons and daughters of college employees during the college hours.** It is situated in the North Block of the College Campus.

### Uninterrupted Power Supply/ Green Power

For smooth running of classes and other allied activities, Tihu College has already installed a powerful generator each, with 20 kV capacity, in both the blocks within the campus. Another powerful 10 kV UPS has been installed in the Bio-Tech Hub for its uninterrupted and smooth functioning. One more 6 kV UPS has been provided to the Departments of Geography and Mathematics. Moreover, the College has also been trying to generate green energy by installing solar power plants of 2 kW each in Academic Block II, Academic Block III and Women's Hostel.

### Automatic Raingauge Station

It is a welcome gesture of India Meteorological Station, Govt. of India, to allot an Automatic Raingauge Station at our college. This station will certainly help geography dept. students as well as local scholars to monitor the atmospheric state and rainfall patterns in and around Tihu locality.

### UGC Star College Scheme

Tihu College has been brought under the Star College Scheme of the DBT, Govt. of India for the vertical upliftment of the science departments of the college. At present, grants have been allocated for upliftment of the three departments- Botany, Physics and Chemistry- initially for three years. These departments have been facilitated with all modern amenities including laboratory facilities for bettering the standard of education imparted to the students of the concerned departments right from the current academic session.

### Endangered Green Bank

A brainchild of the Botanical Society of Tihu College, an Endangered Green Bank was established in the academic session, 2014-15, within the main campus (North Block) of the college. The Green Bank has been instrumental in conservation of the locally available but endangered plant species, particularly the fruit bearing ones. Various endangered species of plants have already been planted in this garden as a measure to preserve those locally available species on the verge of extinction.

The IQAC has been set up in 2004 with a view to achieving action plans for quality evaluation, quality sustenance and quality upgradation of the College. ## Special Coaching for SC/ST

At present, the Map Lab (GIS Laboratory) has facilities and provision of drawing and supply of maps at nominal cost. ## UGC Network Resource Centre

## Identity Card

A non-transferable Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. The card containing relevant information of the holder along with a recent stamp size photograph is duly endorsed by the principal. Along with the Identity Card, students have to procure a college logo to be stitched to their uniforms.

I- Cards are issued/renewed annually. Old I-Cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic year. If necessary, a duplicate copy may be issued to the students on payment of a stipulated amount with the admission receipt.

## College Uniform

The Uniform (black & special cream colour) for boys and girls (H.S. & Undergraduate) is compulsory for every working day. The P.G students have to wear a uniform of dark pink & ash colour. Any student without uniform will be debarred from attending classes.

In view of the Covid 19 pandemic, it is mandatory for every student to wear mask within the college premises. For HS and Undergraduate students, the mask shall be of black colour and the Post-Graduate students shall wear a mask of ash colour at par with their uniform.

## Reservation of Seats

As per Govt. rules a few seats are reserved for SC, ST, OBC, MOBC, Physically challenged persons etc. A few seats are also reserved for deserving students in extra-curricular activities and for sons & daughters of the employees of Tihu College.

## Stipend under UGC Schemes

A stipend will be provided to the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/ Minority/Physically challenged and Economically backward communities having Below Poverty Line cards on merit and proportion basis as per provision and allocation of UGC Schemes. Besides, the students resorting for undertaking vocational courses under Community College Scheme are provided with a handsome stipend each in conformity with UGC Guidelines.

## Students' Mutual Aid Fund

Meritorious-cum-poor students who have secured at least 60% marks in the last examination and are not in receipt of any scholarship are eligible to apply for some monetary relief. Genuine cases are favourably considered by the Academic Council/Principal of the College.

## Information and Career Guidance Cell (ICGC)

This cell helps the students by providing latest information about various career development and employment opportunities. It organises special classes on career counselling by experts from outside with the aid of UGC. One of its regular deliberations is to arrange a two-week career counselling session for TDC 6<sup>th</sup> Semester appearing students who are given free counselling and guidance regarding their future avocations.

**N.B.-** The applicant should read carefully the following rules before filling up the Admission Form of Arts Stream.

(i) He/ She should mention five/six elective subjects in the Form preference-wise, so that he/she may be allowed to take any three/four subjects after counselling.

(ii) In the event of exceeding the maximum enrolment capacity, which is 180 for any subject in a class, Elective Subjects may be selected by the Admission Committee, and in this respect the decision of the Committee shall be final.

### (II) Four Year Undergraduate Programme

Tihu College has already implemented the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) at par with the National Education Policy, 2020 (NEP 2020) from the academic session, 2023-24 as devised by the Gauhati University. This new system provides the opportunity of choice and flexibility to the learners to pursue their intended course of study. The intended implementation of the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) is aimed at achieving holistic growth in the learners' knowledge with an eye on imparting entrepreneurial skill component in specific areas as desired by the student scholars that will enable them to become self dependent in their life in society at large. The new FYUGP semester system will also facilitate the student scholars with the facility of multiple entry and exit because of provisions of issuing certificates and diplomas at different stages on completion of one or two years, and the degree at the completion of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

A student seeking admission into FYUGP 1<sup>st</sup> Semester (Arts, Commerce and Science) course has to complete the entire course in eight semesters (two semesters per year) as per the schedule framed by G.U. Some important points of regulation and syllabus regarding the new system framed by G.U. are given in the next section.

## Salient Features: Credit Framework

Each semester of a 4-Year Bachelor Degree (FYUGP) course will have a maximum of 22 credits with a total of 132 credits for 3-Year Degree Course and 176 credits for a 4-Year Degree Course. Apparently, the Masters Course will have 44 credits in a year with a total of 88 credits in two years. The baseline for total credits is 120 for a 3-Year course and 160 for a 4-Year course. So, a student can choose to have a total credit between 120 and 132 by the end of a 3-Year Bachelor Degree course.

In the 4<sup>th</sup> year, there are however two options – (a) Degree with Honours and (b) Degree with Honours and Research. Overall, a 3-Year Degree course consists of two sections - a Core Section and a Common Section. While the Core Section consists of Major and Minor papers, the Common Section is divided into 5 sub-groups.

## Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII.

## Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

These are 8-credit courses covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

## Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have four skill courses starting from Semester III.

## Value-based Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. Altogether, they will have a credit allocation of 6.

## Internship

**All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4.**

The base credit score for a 3-Year course is 120 and a student needs to have at least 50% of 120 i.e. 60 credits in a subject to qualify for a major in that subject. In the same way, a minor course will have 12 credits and a student can have two minors with a total of 24 credits. Apart from the Major subject, if a student can obtain 48 credits in a particular subject, she/he will get a double major.

## Important Characteristics of the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Gauhati University

- (1) There will be eight semesters covering 4 (Four) years.
- (2) Definite weightage has been given to internal assessment.

Internal assessment / evaluation	=	20%
External (semester end) evaluation	=	80%
- (3) There shall be one sessional examination in each semester.
- (4) There is provision for clearance of absent or failed papers.
- (5) There are primarily five types of courses in FYUGP - Core Course, Common Course, Ability Enhancement Course, Skill Enhancement Course and Value Added Course.
- (5) The system is more learner-centric and learner-friendly as it offers the students both flexibility in completing a course and facilitation of more choice.
- (6) One credit implies one full theory class hour. If there is a four credit course, it implies that the course will be delivered four hours a week. In case of subjects having practical classes, one credit will comprise of two one hour practical sessions.
- (7) Number of credits will depend on the number of classes attended by a learner.
- (8) A learner must attend a minimum of 75% of classes to become eligible to sit in the semester end examination.
- (9) There will be both Major and Minor Course papers in case of scholars offering Major Courses side by side the Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) and Value Added Courses (VAC) spread across the undergraduate programme.
- (10) Those offering only Minor Courses, will also have Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) and Value Added Courses (VAC) side by side the regular courses of study
- (11) The course layout scheme for the entire undergraduate programme including the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semesters is available in the Gauhati University Web Portal. Students can easily access all relevant information regarding the syllabi for different programmes and the course structure and content from the portal in the university website [www.gu.ac.in](http://www.gu.ac.in). The 4<sup>th</sup> year of the programme will, however, rely more on research than on theoretical academic preoccupation.



## BCA & PGDCA Courses

Six Semester Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) & Two Semester Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) courses have been introduced under the regulations of Gauhati University. These two job-oriented courses are meant for interested students of the community. The Department of Computer Science has been striving hard to extend quality teaching-learning facilities to its bonafide students.

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

## General Rules

The college lays great emphasis on discipline and character building of the students. So, they must abide by the rules and regulations of the college and the hostel.

1. Using mobile phone inside the classroom is strictly prohibited though the scholars are permitted to bring mobiles for seamless accessibility. One who violates the rule is liable to pay a fine of Rs. 500/-.
2. College uniform is compulsory for every teaching day. Students without uniform will not be allowed to enter the college campus.
3. Wearing of mask within the college campus has been made compulsory in view of the Covid19 pandemic. Students shall maintain social distance as far as practicable.
4. Smoking, spitting, throwing waste indecently, destroying college property, making noise and loitering in the campus may lead to pecuniary fine or expulsion from the college or both.
5. All forms of ragging in the college or in the Hostel are strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken against those involved in such unconstitutional activities.
6. The Identity Card should be brought to the college every day and is to be produced whenever asked for.

## Attendance Rules

1. Attendance in class is compulsory.
2. Students failing to attend at least 75% of the classes in each subject will forfeit the benefits of scholarship and other facilities (e.g. contesting in college election etc.). He/She will not even be allowed to sit for any final examinations.
3. Names of the students who fail to attend their classes for first 15 days will be struck off from the respective Major Course.

## Library Rules

1. Two 'Library Cards' are issued to the students of both H.S. and Undergraduate students for transaction of books from Central Library. Students with Major Course in any subject are allowed one Additional Card. Besides, the Library Committee of Tihu College has the right to issue more cards to meritorious and deserving students.
2. In no case can a student keep a book for more than 15 days from the date of issue. The books may be re-issued for another 15 days in consultation with the Librarian.
3. If he/she does not return the book within 15 days a fine of Re.1/- (one) per day up to 15 days and Rs. 2/- (two) per day thereafter will be imposed.

## Hostel Rules

1. All hostel boarders are required to maintain hostel rules strictly. A copy of 'Hostel Rules' will be provided to each boarder at the time of Hostel Admission.
2. A boarder indulged in ragging, damaging hostel property or violating hostel rules is liable to be expelled from the hostel as well as from the college.
3. Hostel remains closed during summer/winter breaks and Puja vacations.

4. Hostel boarders are required to keep their rooms tidy, neat and clean and observe proper methods of disposal of garbage.
5. Outstation leave will be granted only on production of an application by the boarder which is duly signed by the parents or the local guardian.

## Election Rules of TCSU

1. The election to the Tihu College Students' Union (TCSU) is held as per guidelines of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, dated 22-09-2006. The important guidelines are as follows:
  - (i) Undergraduate students between the ages of 17 and 22, only can contest the election.
  - (ii) The candidates should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
  - (iii) The candidates should have the minimum percentage of attendance in classes as prescribed by the university or 75% attendance, whichever is higher.
  - (iv) A candidate shall have only one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer.
  - (v) The candidates shall not have any previous criminal record. Besides, the candidates shall not be subject to any disciplinary action by the College Authority.
  - (vi) The candidates must be a regular full-time student of the college.
2. The election rules will be announced by an Election Officer, appointed by the Principal to conduct the TCSU election. Every year, the election is held on the date mentioned in the Academic Calendar.
3. Student voters are required to produce their Identity Cards while casting their votes.
4. The elected members must obey the constitution of Tihu College Students' Union.
5. All the relevant rules regarding election to TCSU can be accessed from the Constitution of the College on request.

## EXAMINATION RULES

1. All students must appear in all the examinations conducted by the college during an academic year.
2. Any student who is unwell may be permitted to avail of the sick room facility during an examination.
3. A student not appearing in any subject of internal examinations shall be declared to be 'Absent', which will be entered in the marks sheet of Internal Assessment.
4. Internal Assessment is compulsory for Undergraduate students.
5. Internal examinations are conducted by an Internal Examination Board and the decision of the Board regarding examination shall be final.

# ADMISSION PROCEDURE

## FOR FRESH CANDIDATES

1. Admission into the college is made strictly on the basis of merit and is governed by the college admission rules. The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final.
2. A candidate seeking admission into the college in the HS 1<sup>st</sup> year / Undergraduate 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> Semester class must apply online in the prescribed Admission Form to be uploaded in the college website. A candidate seeking online admission into the Four Year Undergraduate Programme and Postgraduate 1<sup>st</sup> Semester Programme for the session 2024-25 must apply through the SAMARTH Portal of the Govt. of Assam, through the link <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>.
3. As directed by the Govt. of Assam, Tihu College has extended the facility of FREE ADMISSION to all financially backward students as directed by the Govt. of Assam. They need to submit a true copy of their respective Ration Cards along with the hard copy of the admission forms.
4. It is to be noted that maximum enrolment in any of the Elective Subjects in a class for the session 2025-26 is raised to 220 at par with the state govt. directions. Elective Subjects (in both H.S. and Undergraduate levels) may be selected preference wise by the Admission Committee from the subjects mentioned by the applicant in the Admission Form.
5. Admission will be ONLINE only. A candidate has to upload scanned copies of the following documents (size not more than 100 kb each) on the admission portal -
  - (a) Marks sheet of the last qualifying examination.
  - (b) Character Certificate/ Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
  - (c) Caste Certificate/ Gap Certificate/ Other relevant Certificate(s) wherever necessary from competent authority.
  - (d) Certificate showing candidates' Date of Birth.Candidates are also required to submit one additional stamp size recent photograph for Identity card at the time of admission.

7. As per Govt. rules a few seats are reserved for students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, MOBC and physically challenged categories. A few seats are also reserved for deserving candidates in extra-curricular activities and for sons/ daughters of the employees of Tihu College.

Candidates seeking admission against reserved quota must submit the requisite certificates issued by the competent authority along with their Admission Form.

8. Major subject in B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> Semester must be allowed by the Head of the Department concerned before the date of admission, subject to a maximum number of 30 students per class per semester in case of Arts & Commerce Subjects, and 25 students per class per semester for Science Subjects, including Geography. *There may be Entrance Tests to Major Courses in case the concerned department deems it fit in the event of students' demand beyond the permissible intake capacity.*

9. If a student desires to change his/ her subject after taking admission, he/ she must apply to the Principal within 7 days from the commencement of classes. However his/ her application may be granted on the basis of availability of seats in the concerned subject, with the nod of approval by the Head of the Department concerned.

### FREE ADMISSION

As per the Rule of the Govt. of Assam, vide Letter No. PC/HE/SOPD/02/2017/20 dated Kahilipara, the 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2017, and the recent DHE Circular regarding admission into colleges and universities during 2024-25, the scheme for Waiver of Admission Fee will be applicable to all students seeking admission into First/Second Year H.S./ B.A./ B.Sc. for this session in view of the Covid 19 relief and rehabilitation measures adopted by the Govt. *Students taking admission in any self-financing course are not eligible for free admission under this scheme.*

## Admission of Unsuccessful Students

1. The unsuccessful students of H.S. 1<sup>st</sup> year Exam can take admission as Casual Students just after the completion of regular admission in H.S. 1<sup>st</sup> year.

2. Unsuccessful candidates of H.S. (Sc) Final Exam. who appear from this college shall have to attend requisite number of practical classes. The same rule will apply to unsuccessful candidates of H.S. (Arts) Final Exam., if they have Geography or Computer Science as a subject. So those students shall have to take Casual Admission in H.S. 2<sup>nd</sup> year class as notified by the College Authority.

3. Unsuccessful candidates of B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. 6<sup>th</sup> Semester Final Exam. under G.U. appearing from this college shall have to enrol their names as Casual Students or to take permission from the College Authority to appear in the Final Examination.

## Admission to BCA & PGDCA Courses

1. No separate admission forms will be issued for BCA and PGDCA courses from the college office and the admission will be conducted online. The dates of admission are notified by the Principal, Tihu College, which normally falls within the months of July and January.

2. Admission must be taken in every semester.

3. Admission fees will be fixed by the College Authority.

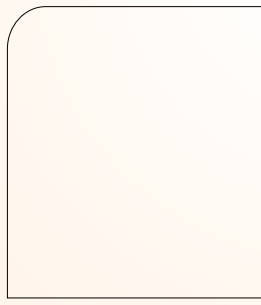

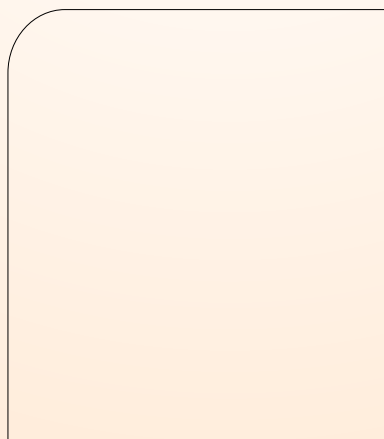
